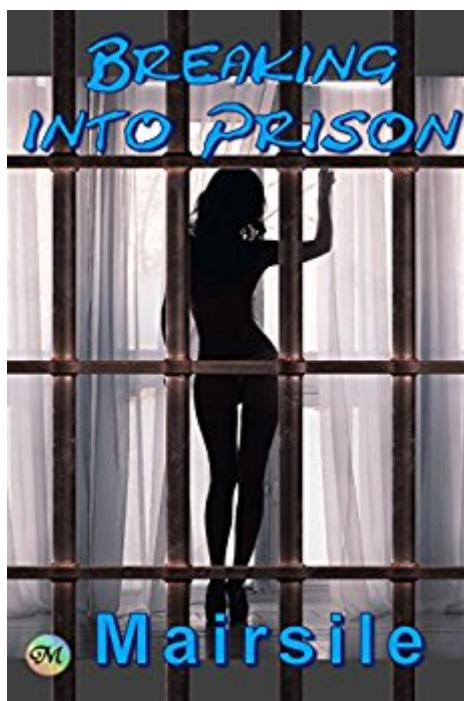


The book was found

Although the book was well written there were problems that I just could not ignore. First problem was that the two main characters fell in love almost instantly. I know there is love at first sight but honestly with one of the main characters being agoraphobic and trying to get over her dead wife it makes no sense that she would fall in love with someone that fast. Then there is the problem that neither character knows a lot about one another at all. The story seemed very rushed to me. Another thing I noticed, the author twice switched from past tense prose to present tense prose which made no sense. This is a common problem with self published books. The author needs a editor or someone to read the story before releasing.

This was a great book that I was sad to finish. The author did a wonderful job with the characters, and left me wanting more. I recommend this book to mystery fans, but it was also a psychological thriller along with some lesbian romance, but the romance was the least of the book for me. I look forward to more from the author!
