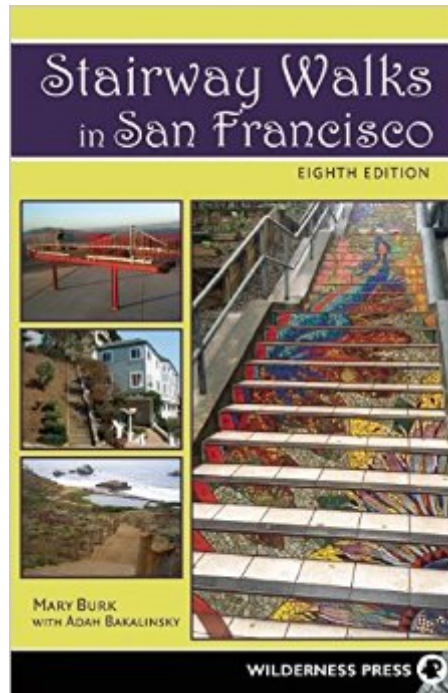

It's a great book, but it would be helpful to list approximate time it takes for each walk and a level of difficulty from 1 to 5. I like how she goes by neighborhood and tells how you can connect one walk to another. I've only taken 2 so far, but am eager to try them all!

The walks I did were great for that, and the book guided me with precision to little gems in the neighborhood. I would recommend the book to residents and tourists alike.
